CULTURAL EXHIBIT

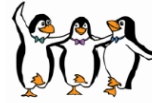

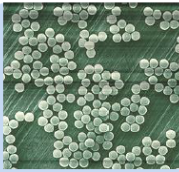

What are Microbeads?

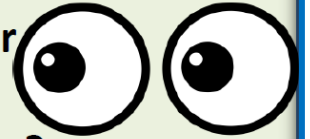


Microbeads are tiny plastic particles used in many personal care products such as facial scrubs, soaps, shampoos, toothpaste. When we use products containing microbeads, the tiny plastic pieces don't dissolve. Instead, they are rinsed down the drain and end up in our rivers, lakes, and oceans. Once in the water, microbeads can absorb toxic chemicals. Wildlife of all sizes consume this plastic.



Solid plastic microbeads are made from polyethylene, polypropylene, polyethyleneterephthalate (PET), polymethyl methacrylate (PMMA) and nylon. Phasing out synthetic microbeads is a common sense step to keep plastic out of our water. When humans consume seafood, they are at risk of toxins.
