| Amigdalota \$1.75 | Almond sweets made from honey, almonds, flour, water and sugar. |
| Baklava \$2.00 | Flaky fillo layered with butter and walnuts and topped with Greek syrup. |
| Kataifi \$2.00 | Pastry strands wrapped around walnuts baked with butter, dipped in honey. |
| Melomacaroni \$1.25 | Cookies dipped in syrup and topped with chopped nuts. |
| Koulourakia \$.75 | A buttery twisted shortbread cookie. |
| Galaktobouriko \$2.50 | A baked farina custard between fillo leaves and topped with Greek syrup. |
| Kourambiethes \$1.25 | A delicate butter cookie rolled in powdered sugar. |
| Pecan Blossoms \$2.00 | Flaky fillo dough swirled with butter and walnuts. |
| Loukoumades 6 for \$2.25 | Honey dipped doughnut puffs topped with chopped nuts and cinnamon. |
